BIG WINS!

- In September the University was awarded TEF Gold Status, thanks in part to the Student Written Submission.
- We worked with the University Estates team to increase the capacity for Friday prayers, almost doubling this important provision for students
- The Students' Union supported the University to raise the profile of John Cadbury House as a destination for Aston Alumni.
- We submitted a further Student Written Submission for the university Access and Participation Plan.
- At the start of the year we formally opened the new social learning space for students on floor seven of the main building.
- Working with the University to create new guidance on how students may us AI now and in the future.

Our student officers directly speak to University senior leadership to bring to their attention key issues for students on campus.

We ran the EPS Town Hall event to consider impacts of staff changes, which was attended by over **80** students.

We increased the number of student voice advocates to over **30**, these volunteers have enhanced roles and responsibility through the college structures.

403 students registered themselves to volunteer as Course Reps, helping develop career boosting graduate skills and more importantly amplifying the student voice across the University.

The new School Representative scheme continues to shine with **25** students, taking on a leadership role with their school and course rep scheme.

This year we have introduced Research Reps, as the University looks to increase and diversify its research excellence we want to ensure that PGR students feel heard as staff members and as students.

Over **200** nominations were received for Academic Awards, one of the best nights of the year where we recognised best practise within the University staff team and the student volunteer course reps. We continued to support the campaigns for the National Student Survey (NSS) and Post Graduate Taught Survey (PTES). Over 70% of final year undergraduates completed the NSS survey.

We support the organisation and delivery of the Inaugural Student Experience Conference, working with **BSS** and **WONKHE** to bring the stories of our students to life in front the decision makers at the University.



CELEBRATING DIVERSITY <u>&</u> CREATING A CAMPUS COMMUNITY

Supported the University's ambition to become a University of Sanctuary Status with the establishment of a Student Action for refugees Network.

We embedded the **SU Student Pantry** as a place to support students with the Cost of Living with additional food bundles during the year for students to take home.

THOUSANDS of students attended Diwali, Navratri, Winter Village & Holi.

2200 students and staff enjoyed the greatest ever Astonbury.

HELPING STUDENTS BEFORE THEY NEED IT

Our members often get frisky with each other, and we want to make sure they do it in a safe and consensual way.

So we have run **2** sexual health campaigns and fairs during the year as well as a partnership with city-based Umbrella - the experts in sexual health and guidance.

Our wellbeing campaigns are aimed at supporting students before they need formal help and support.

We organised **2** Wellbeing Days with over **700** students over the year.

We have provided over **2000** free breakfasts for students each Wednesday morning in an effort to combat the costof-living situation and provide a place for students to feel a sense of belonging. We continue to use digital platforms as a medium to get information, advice, and guidance to students. Our informational advice video, including a walking tour of student support services at Aston University have been played 13,176 times by 6500 different student accounts.

We developed bespoke information advice and guidance about Healthcare in Birmingham for International Students.

In May mental health month our Mind, Body & Grades campaigns and workshops better prepared **XX** students for the upcoming exams. Our Welcome Week program of events had 46 events to help manage the transition to Aston University life for new students.

We actively supported the neurodiversity living library events in the year and provide insight and a student perspective with regards to neurodiversity accessibility requirements and solutions.

Aston SU Instagram interacts with **20** students on average each week on direct messages helping with all enquiries.

Our Green Impact Report could be our best yet, proving our commitment to sustainability and driving best practise across campus, we await with baited breath for the outcome.

HELPING STUDENTS WHEN THEY NEED IT

Our Aston Student Advice service offers free impartial independent confidential advice. Students can access the service every weekday with drop-in appointments available betweeen 10:30am - 12:30pm.

For the calendar year 2023 we supported a record number of students. 1209 students used the service with over 1400 individual cases. This number has doubled since 2020!



10,000 emails were exchanged by the Advice Service.

The Students' Union website has a Recite Me function for students who need support navigating or using the website.

Our video helping students find places to study on campus has been viewed 15,000 times.

The Students' Union building is open when the rest of campus is closed, providing students with a safe space to relax at the end of each day, and a chance to socialise.



HELPING STUDENTS WITH THEIR ACCOMMODATION

776

students attended our bi-annual accommodation fairs to help students understand and make better informed decisions about accommodation.

7000 bed spaces are available to view and consider on our Accommodation Portal website. The Green offers the best value student accommodation in the area. Saving students over £650,000 per year, compared to on campus living and being a major recruitment USP.

The Green office and site is staffed from 10am - 4pm on weekdays plus out of hours support 24/7 (Resident Warden).

We have worked hard at creating a sense of belonging at The Green with a variety of Community events for the **160** residents.



Despite being exceptional value for money we are continuously improving the physical standard, by installing new kitchens and bathrooms.

To assist students with their own cost-ofliving issues rent have only increased by £2 per week.

We provide the only place for accommodation, information, advice and guidance on campus. With over **3500** email exchanges, from supporting students with short stays to housing families and finding places for children.





HELPING STUDENTS HAVE FUN, STAY HEALTHY & BECOME MORE EMPLOYABLE

We support and help manage 100 sports clubs and societies, who in turn support 1035 and 2740 members respectively, providing students with life changing and life affirming opportunities for growth, learning and belonging and fun.

The largest cohort of societies are the 42 Academic Societies, who work hard to create a sense of community and belonging aligned with their courses.



Many student societies are local and meet a niche need for Aston Students, others are a part of a global network (TEDx).

Over **400** students have leadership roles within the groups, gaining and developing skills that help them stand out in the job market.

We enjoy **18** weeks of sports fixture, every Wednesday afternoon in term one and two. We play teams across the Midlands and as far away as East Anglia.

We have bought Zumba to the masses this year... well our Vice President Student Activities (and incoming President) JC has!

280 of our Sports men and women celebrated in black tie style at their annual Athletic Union Ball held at Villa Park. Collaboration across our groups has been key this year with events such as Take Me Out, Strictly Dance Aston, Badminton cross-society tournament and Netball crosssociety tournament proving immensely popular.



HELPING STUDENTS HAVE FUN, STAY HEALTHY & BECOME MORE EMPLOYABLE

Payments and reimbursements are made on a prompt basis to ensure they can keep track of finance for their clubs and societies. This supports them to run their activities and events.

We celebrated the great student talent at Aston with not one, but two Aston Got Talent (AGT) events, with a total of 20 participants and **100s** in the audience. We continue to protect freedom of speech and debate and discussion on campus with **428** guest speaker requests managed on behalf of societies. A significant increase on the previous year.

We introduced the Activities Dashboard, an online portal where all events are registered, creating a more efficient and streamlined service for staff and students.

We provide the most diverse and inclusive space for students to enjoy themselves, in our licensed venue over **35%** of all meat products we sell are Halal, no other licensed space in the city would offer such a diverse menu.

The Lounge and Shop will enjoy around 115,000 transactions in anyone year, the busiest face to face service on campus, providing some much-needed food and drink and friendly chat with each students. The Students' Union secured a 5* Food and Hygeine rating with the City Council inspective- providing a safe space, to a high standard to eat and buy goods.

The building remained open and available to students throughout the year including bespoke opening times for key sports events (Indian Premier League).

Students will play **12,000** games of pool and the Thursday Night Quiz is always a sell-out!

We help support and promote the University Brand with **3300** branded goods sold during the year, across the world. Our spaces will support around **12,800** visits for Friday prayers in anyone year.

We provide a space for students to watch the best live sports, without having to buy a single item!

The casual team of student staff make up the backbone of those delivering the service and have worked over **5000** hours in the year.

Aston Students' Union Instagram Channel has **over 8k** followers, and this channel offers a first point contact for students. We answer DM's each week and help them with their enquiry.

27,000 accounts are reached via our Instagram reels, and 'Places to Study' reel reached 10.2k accounts with 18k plays.

Our reels page is the best place to see vibrant and student centered content anywhere.

We have our first ever independent officer fan page for Vice President Student Activities Juan Carlos, with 98 followers. GO JC! The website has a bounce rate of **38%**, average engagement time **2min 24sec** and **24k** impressions.

Over **18,000** pages are reached using Recite Me accessibility tool, creating an inclusive digital experience for students.

We have further segmented our fortnightly newsletter and enjoy an average open rate of **27.2%**. This is still our most successful and important communication tool. Our commercial partnership with Native thrived into its second year with an impressive range of student-centered promotion and events for students, with a great Welcome Fair in September.

We lit up campus in the depths of winter with amazing Astonbury External projections.

Our Audit Partner, Crowe, delivered clean audit for the organisation, showing our ability to meet our financial and legal compliance requirements.

77% staff engagement score for the year, up 4% on last year, with one of the best results for Students' Union in the country.

We welcomed new staff and roles in Student Voice, Wellbeing and Marketing.



We introduced major structural changes to our Trustee Board with the addition of an External Chair of the Board. This will provide improved oversight and consistency of the Trustee Board in its role to ensure the Students' Union is run well and well run.

Our Trustee Board agreed a new People and Culture plan for the Students' Union, this included the review and amendments of all the employments policies and procedures.
